Background

On December 14, 2022, the Board adopted a Resolution of intention to annex the parcel referenced above to the District's On-Site Wastewater Disposal Zone. The Public Hearing date was established as February 8, 2023

Analysis

The District's *Master Resolution Governing Annexations of Territory to the West Bay Sanitary District On-Site Disposal Zone* states: "Pursuant to Section 6959 of the Health and Safety Code, the date of the Public Hearing shall be commenced no less than 45 days nor more than 60 days from the date of adoption of the Resolution of Intention, and the Public Hearing shall be completed no more than 90 days after the first day of the hearing."

In accordance with Section 6960, and 6960.1 of the same code, reviews and reports of findings are required of both the County Health Officer and Regional Water Quality Control Board. Additionally, Section 6960.3 of this code requires the review and approval by a local agency formation commission, which has adopted rules and regulations affecting the functions and services of special districts.

The San Mateo County Health Officer has responded by a letter of approval dated January 17, 2023 a copy of which is attached; the San Francisco Bay Regional Water Quality Control Board responded by a letter of approval dated January 23, 2023, a copy of which is attached; and the San Mateo Local Agency Formation Commission has approved per their Resolution No. 1293 dated July 20, 2022, a copy of which is attached.

Fiscal Impact

Property owners have paid all annexation fees and the fiscal impact would be additional sewer service charge revenue to the District once the parcel is connected.

Recommendation

The Board is asked to close the Public Hearing following public comment.

Dear Bill Kitajima:

The Regional Water Board hereby approves the annexation of the subject parcel to the On-Site Wastewater Disposal Zone of the West Bay Sanitary District (District). The property owners applied to the District for annexation "for the purpose of obtaining sewer service for a single-family residence." To connect to existing District sewer facilities, the property owners require a Grinder Pump System that the District must maintain. Therefore, this parcel must be annexed into the District's disposal zone.

The Regional Water Board's approval is conditional upon the District (1) retaining responsibility for operation and maintenance of the grinder pump system, and (2) ensuring the proper operation and maintenance of the other sewerage facilities serving the parcel. Disposal of sewage onto soils within the disposal zone is not approved.

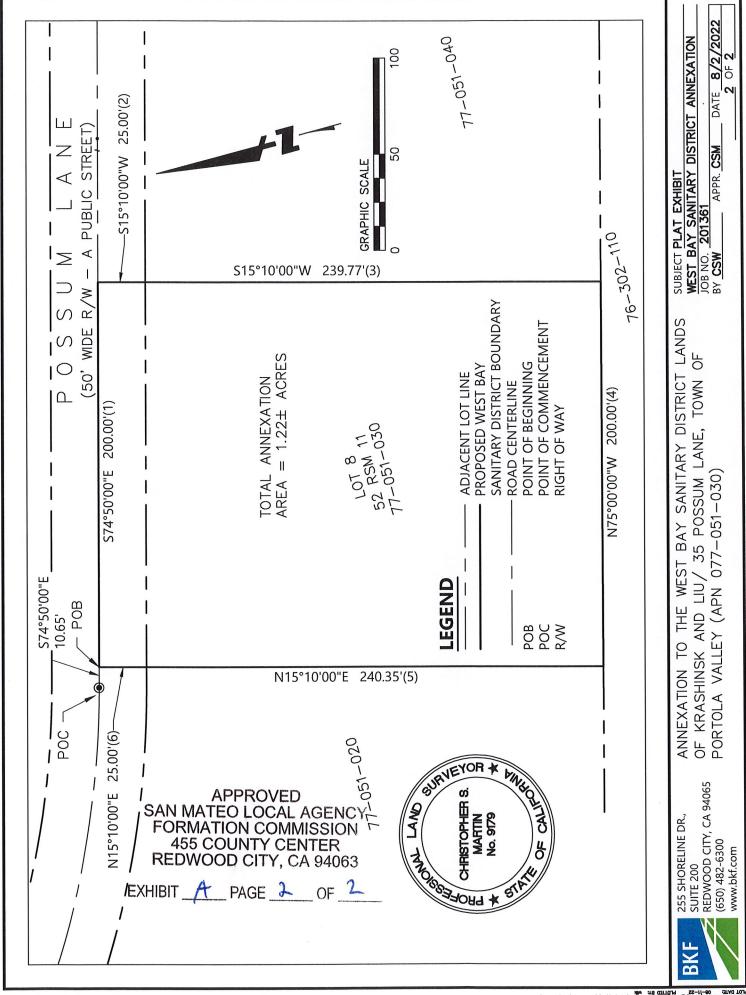

Background

This property will utilize a STEP system; consequently this property must be annexed into the District's On-Site Wastewater Disposal Zone. The proponent shall be required to install a STEP system and connect to a WBSD force main (FM) located near the intersection of Westridge Drive and Meadow Lane.

Analysis

Following the Public Hearing to annex certain territory to the District's On-Site Wastewater Disposal Zone, the attached resolution would formally complete the annexation of the referenced Lands of Davidson.

Fiscal Impact

Property owners have paid all annexation fees and the fiscal impact would be additional sewer service charge revenue to the District once the parcel is connected.

Recommendation

Subject to the final review by legal counsel and the findings of the resolution holding true through the public hearing (i.e., protests by less than 35 percent of the voters and landholders), it is recommended by the Office & Communications Manager that the Board adopt the resolution as drafted.

RESOLUTION NO. _____ (2023)

RESOLUTION ORDERING ANNEXATION OF CERTAIN TERRITORY OF WEST BAY SANITARY DISTRICT TO THE WEST BAY SANITARY DISTRICT ON-SITE WASTEWATER DISPOSAL ZONE INCLUDING CERTAIN DETERMINATIONS, FINDINGS AND DECLARATIONS OF THE DISTRICT BOARD (LANDS OF KRASHINSKY & LIU)

The District Board of West Bay Sanitary District determines, finds and declares as follows:

- (a) The proceedings, which are the subject of the Resolution, are undertaken pursuant to Chapter 3 of Part 2 of Division 5 (commencing with Section 6950) of the California Health & Safety ("H & S") Code having to do with the formation of, and annexations to, on-site wastewater disposal zones.
- (b) On December 14, 2022 the District Board approved and adopted Resolution No. 2370 (2022), "RESOLUTION OF INTENTION TO ANNEX CERTAIN TERRITORY TO THE WEST BAY SANITARY DISTRICT ON-SITE WASTEWATER DISPOSAL ZONE." Among other things, Resolution No. 2370 (2022) described the area to be annexed to the zone, the name and address of the applicant and the number, type, volume and location of on-site wastewater disposal systems proposed.
- (c) Pursuant to Resolution No. 2370 (2022), a public hearing was noticed in the manner required by H&S § 6958. The public hearing was commenced on February 8, 2023 and closed on February 8, 2023.
- (d) Prior to the close of the hearing, the District Board received and considered reports from the following public officials and agencies as required by law:
 - i. From the Public Health and Environmental Protection Division, Health Services Agency of the County of San Mateo, a letter dated January 17, 2023, constituting the report of the local health officer specifying the matters required by H & S § 6960.1.
 - <u>ii.</u> From the California Regional Water Quality Control Board, San Francisco Bay Region, a letter dated January 23, 2023 constituting the report of the affected regional water quality control board with regard to the matters required by H & S § 6960.1 and approving the proposed plan for wastewater disposal by the affected regional water quality control board required by H & S § 6960.4.
 - <u>iii.</u> From San Mateo Local Agency Formation Commission, a letter by which the commission approved annexation to the District and the District's On-Site Wastewater Disposal Zone.

- (e) At all times during the public hearing, the District was prepared to hear and receive any oral or written protests, objections and evidence which might be offered. No oral or written protests, objections or evidence in opposition to the proposal were made, presented or filed at any time. Therefore, pursuant to H & S § 6963, it is determined that written protests filed and not withdrawn prior to the conclusion of the public hearing represented:
 - <u>i.</u> Less than 35 percent of the number of voters who reside in the territory to be annexed to the zone; and
 - ii. Less than 35 percent of the number of owners of real property in the territory to be annexed to the zone who also own not less than 35 percent of the assessed value of real property in the territory to be annexed to the zone.
- (f) The number and types of on-site wastewater disposal systems proposed to be acquired, operated, maintained and monitored in the territory to be annexed to the zone are in conformity with and do not exceed the limitations set forth in the reports referred to (d) <u>i.</u> and <u>ii.</u> above.
- (g) The territory proposed for annexation to the zone contains two (2) voters as defined in the Elections Code.
- (h) Operation of the zone in the territory to be annexed will not result in land uses that are not consistent with general plans, zoning ordinances or other land use regulations of the Town of Portola Valley, the County of San Mateo or any other affected public agency.

In consideration of the foregoing determinations, findings and declarations,

IT IS RESOLVED by the District Board as follows:

- 1. The territory described in Exhibit "A" shall be annexed to the West Bay Sanitary District On-Site Wastewater Disposal Zone.
- 2. This annexation shall be accomplished without an election and confirmation of voters within the area to be annexed shall not be required on the question of such annexation.

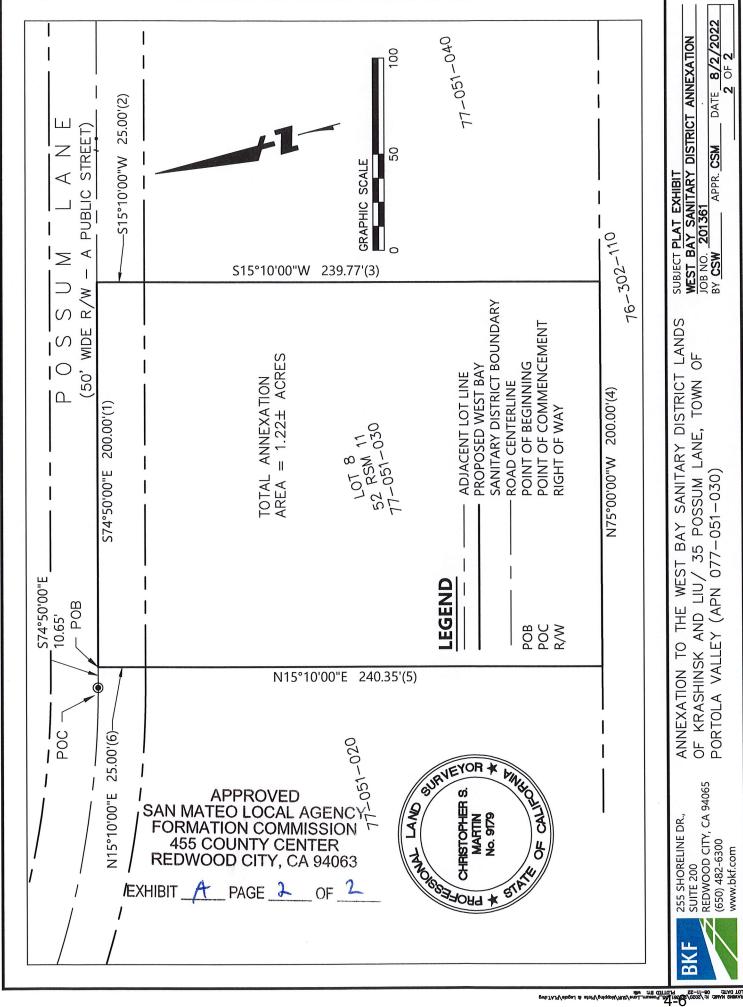

Background

On December 14, 2022, the Board adopted a Resolution of intention to annex the parcel referenced above to the District's On-Site Wastewater Disposal Zone. The Public Hearing date was established as February 8, 2023.

Analysis

The District's *Master Resolution Governing Annexations of Territory to the West Bay Sanitary District On-Site Disposal Zone* states: "Pursuant to Section 6959 of the Health and Safety Code, the date of the Public Hearing shall be commenced no less than 45 days nor more than 60 days from the date of adoption of the Resolution of Intention, and the Public Hearing shall be completed no more than 90 days after the first day of the hearing."

In accordance with Section 6960, and 6960.1 of the same code, reviews and reports of findings are required of both the County Health Officer and Regional Water Quality Control Board. Additionally, Section 6960.3 of this code requires the review and approval by a local agency formation commission, which has adopted rules and regulations affecting the functions and services of special districts.

The San Mateo County Health Officer has responded by a letter of approval dated January 17, 2023 a copy of which is attached; the San Francisco Bay Regional Water Quality Control Board responded by a letter of approval dated January 23, 2023, a copy of which is attached; and the San Mateo Local Agency Formation Commission has approved per their Resolution No. 1295 dated September 22, 2022, a copy of which is attached.

Fiscal Impact

Property owners have paid all annexation fees and the fiscal impact would be additional sewer service charge revenue to the District once the parcel is connected.

Recommendation

The Board is asked to close the Public Hearing following public comment.

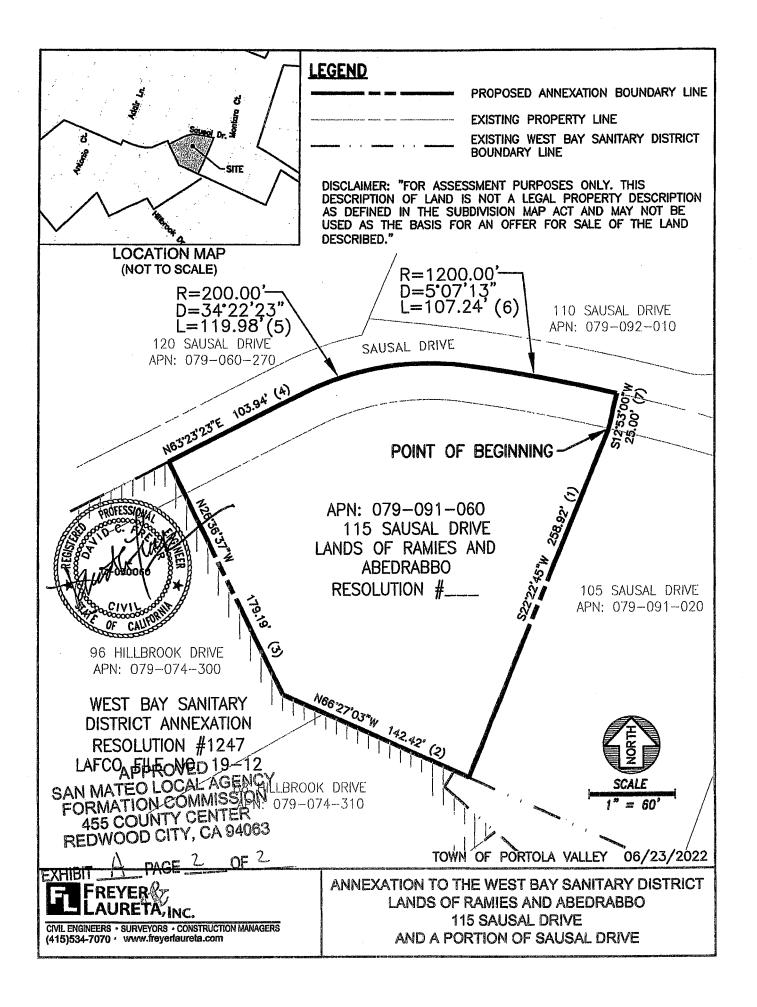

 - <u>ii.</u> From the California Regional Water Quality Control Board, San Francisco Bay Region, a letter dated January 23, 2023 constituting the report of the affected regional water quality control board with regard to the matters required by H & S § 6960.1 and approving the proposed plan for wastewater disposal by the affected regional water quality control board required by H & S § 6960.4.
 - <u>iii.</u> From San Mateo Local Agency Formation Commission, a letter by which the commission approved annexation to the District and the District's On-Site Wastewater Disposal Zone.

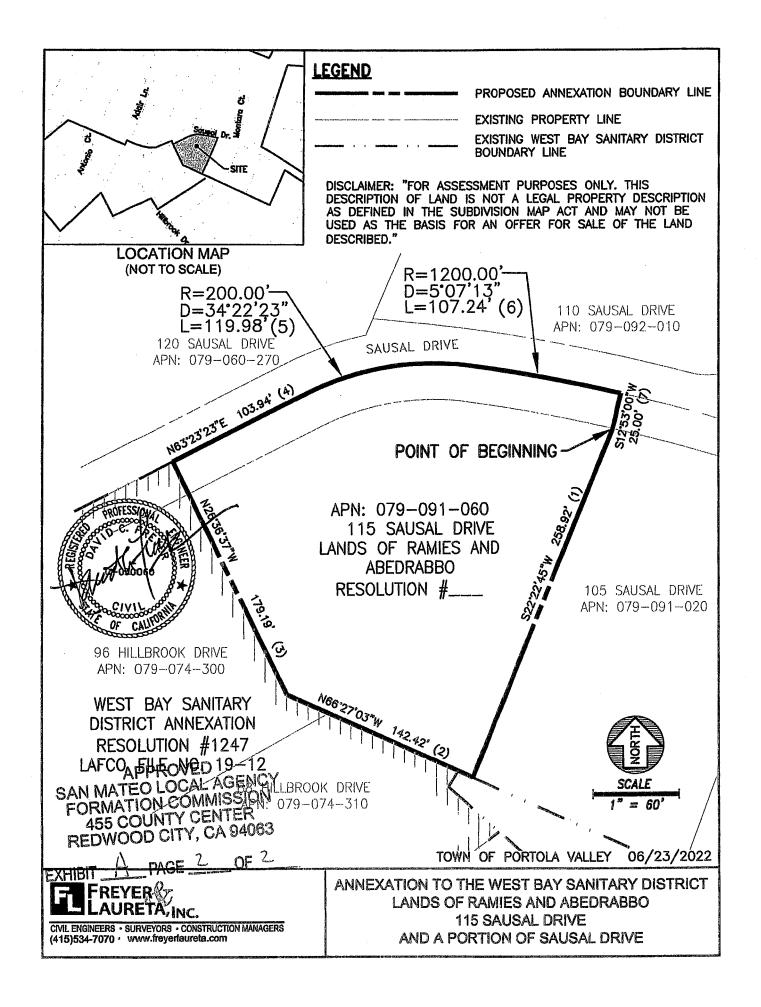

Subject: Public Hearing to Consider Amending the Code of General

Regulations for Board Member Compensation

Background

Per Government Code the compensation that may be paid to a Board Member for each day's attendance at meetings may increase annually by five percent. Since the last increase was in February 2022, the Board could elect to increase up to 5%. This means the Board may increase its compensation from \$250.00 per meeting to \$262.50 per meeting.

At the January 25, 2023 Board Meeting the Board decided to hold a Public Hearing to consider increasing the Board's compensation less than the allowable 5%. The Board will consider approving an increase to an even \$260.00 or 4%.

Analysis

The financial health of the District is such that a small increase in Directors fee expenses would have negligible effect on the budget and increased Director Fees may enhance the Board's efforts to find successor Board members.

Should the Board determine to approve an increase, following the Public Hearing, the Board may adopt the attached Regulation.

Fiscal Impact

An increase of \$ 10.00 per meeting in Board of Director fees would have minor impact on the budget.

Recommendation

The General Manager recommends the Board hold the public hearing as scheduled and determine the level of increase in the Board's compensation and following the public hearing consider a General Regulation amending the Code of General Regulations for Board Member compensation.

Compensation to Board Members attending conferences of the California Association of Sanitation Agencies shall be limited to two day's compensation regardless of the number of days attended.

RE: Resolution Authorizing District to Implement Teleconferenced Public Meetings

Pursuant to Assembly Bill 361

RECOMMENDATION: Adopt resolution authorizing District to continue the use of teleconferenced meetings pursuant to Assembly Bill 361.

BACKGROUND: On March 4, 2020, Governor Newsom issued a proclamation of State of Emergency in response to the developing COVID-19 pandemic. Due to the continued spread of the virus, the Governor issued Executive Order N-29-20 on March 17, 2020, which included a provision authorizing suspensions to the Ralph M. Brown Act's ("Brown Act") teleconferencing rules in order to facilitate virtual meetings while public health orders were in place.

On June 11, 2021, the Governor issued Executive Order N-08-21, which provided that the Brown Act teleconferencing suspensions would expire after September 30, 2021. On September 16, 2021, the Governor signed Assembly Bill 361 ("AB 361"), an urgency measure taking effect immediately, which amended the Brown Act to allow local legislative bodies to continue using teleconferencing and virtual meeting technology provided certain conditions are met.

DISCUSSION: AB 361 allows for teleconferenced meetings during a declared State of Emergency, as defined under the California Emergency Services Act, if one of the following circumstances apply: (1) State of local officials have imposed or recommended measures to promote social distancing; (2) The legislative body is meeting to determine whether, as a result of the emergency, meeting in person would present imminent risks to the health or safety of attendees; or (3) The legislative body has determined that, as a result of the emergency, meeting in person presents imminent risks to the health or safety of attendees.¹

The Governor's March 4, 2020 proclamation of State of Emergency is still in effect. Measures continue to exist that impose and recommend measures to promote social distancing. The California Department of Public Health recommends that individuals wear masks in indoor

public settings.² Additionally, San Mateo County requires that face coverings continue to be worn in indoor settings for all individuals in the County.³

Moreover, in recent months, the highly transmissible delta variant has caused increases in positive cases and hospitalizations locally and throughout the State. According to the CDC, community transmission of COVID-19 in San Mateo County is moderate, however the nature of the pandemic is unpredictable and transmission rates have the potential to rise quickly. As such, holding meetings in person would present imminent risks to the health or safety of attendees due to the continued spread of COVID-19.

To continue teleconferenced meetings under AB 361, the Board of Directors will need to declare every thirty (30) days that it has reconsidered the circumstances of the State of Emergency and either (1) the State of Emergency continues to directly impact the ability of the members to meet safely in person; or (2) State or local health officials continue to impose or recommend measures to promote social distancing.⁴

FISCAL IMPACT: No significant fiscal impact.

Authorizing Remote Teleconference Meeting of the Legislative Bodies of the
West Bay Sanitary District Pursuant to Brown Act Provisions

The Board of Directors of the West Bay Sanitary District ("Agency") does resolve as follows:

WHEREAS, the West Bay Sanitary District is committed to preserving and nurturing public access and participation in meetings of the Board of Directors; and

WHEREAS, all meetings of West Bay Sanitary District's legislative bodies are open and public, as required by the Ralph M. Brown Act (Cal. Gov. Code 54950 – 54963), so that any member of the public may attend, participate, and watch the District's legislative bodies conduct their business; and

WHEREAS, the Brown Act, Government Code section 54953(e), makes provisions for remote teleconferencing participation in meetings by members of a legislative body, without compliance with the requirements of Government Code section 54953(b)(3), subject to the existence of certain conditions; and

WHEREAS, on March 4, 2020, Governor Newsom issued a Proclamation of State of Emergency in response to the COVID-19 pandemic; and,

WHEREAS, on March 17, 2020, Governor Newsom issued Executive Order N-29-20 that suspended the teleconferencing rules set forth in the California Open Meeting law, Government code Section 54950 et seq. (the "Brown Act"), provided certain requirements were met and followed; and

WHEREAS, on June 11, 2021, Governor Newsom issued Executive Order N-08-21 that clarified the suspension of the teleconferencing rules set forth in the Brown Act, and further provided that those provisions would remain suspended through September 30, 2021; and,

WHEREAS, on September 16, 2021, Governor Newsom signed AB 361 which provides that a legislative body subject to the Brown Act may continue to meet without fully complying with the teleconferencing rules in the Brown Act, provided that a State of Emergency is declared by the Governor pursuant to Government Code section 8625, and either state or local officials have imposed or recommended measures to promote social distancing, or the legislative body determines that meeting in person would present imminent risks to the health or safety of attendees, and further requires that certain findings be made by the legislative body every thirty (30) days; and,

WHEREAS, the State of Emergency proclaimed by the Governor on March 4, 2020 remains in effect; and,

WHEREAS, California Department of Public Health ("CDPH") and the federal Centers for Disease Control and Prevention ("CDC") caution that the Delta variant of COVID-19, currently the dominant strain of COVID-19 in the country, is more transmissible than prior variants of the virus, may cause more severe illness, and that even fully vaccinated individuals can spread the virus to others resulting in rapid and alarming rates of COVID-19 cases and hospitalizations (https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/variants/delta-variant.html); and,

WHEREAS, other variants of COVID-19 exist, and it is unknown at this time whether other variants may result in a new surge in COVID-19 cases; and,

WHEREAS, the CDC has established a "Community Transmission" metric with 4 tiers designed to reflect a community's COVID-19 case rate and percent positivity; and,

WHEREAS, San Mateo County currently has a Community Transmission metric of "moderate" which indicates an elevated risk of transmission;

WHEREAS, due to the seriousness of the current pandemic situation, the CDPH has required that all unvaccinated persons wear facial coverings indoors, and the CDC and CDPH recommend that all persons, regardless of vaccination status, wear facial coverings indoors; and,

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors is empowered to take actions necessary to protect public, health, welfare and safety within the region; and,

WHEREAS, the District has an important governmental interest in protecting the health, safety and welfare of those who participate in meetings of the Board of Directors and other District committees; and,

WHEREAS, in the interest of public health and safety, as affected by the emergency caused by the spread of COVID-19, the Board of Directors deems it necessary to find that meeting in person for meetings of the Board of Directors and District committees and subcommittees would present imminent risks to the health or safety of attendees, and thus intends to invoke the provisions of AB 361 related to teleconferencing as provided in subdivision (e) of Government Code section 54953; and

WHEREAS, all teleconferenced meetings of the District Board of Directors and related committees or subcommittees shall comply with the requirements to provide the public with access to meetings as prescribed in paragraph (2) of subdivision (e) of Government Code section 54953;

WHEREAS, State of California and County of San Mateo health officials recommend various social distancing measures, including wearing mask indoors and limiting occupancies at meeting locations; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors does hereby find and determine that the above conditions create a heightened risk to the health and safety of attendees; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Directors of the West Bay Sanitary District does hereby resolve as follows:

Section 1. <u>Recitals</u>. The Recitals set forth above are true and correct and are incorporated into this Resolution by this reference.

Section 2. The Board of Directors finds that as a result of the ongoing proclaimed State of Emergency in California due to the COVID-19 pandemic, and COVID-19's continued spread, holding in person meetings of District legislative bodies would present imminent risks to the health or safety of attendees

Section 3. The General Manager and legislative bodies of West Bay Sanitary District are hereby authorized and directed to take all actions necessary to carry out the intent and purpose of this Resolution including, conducting open and public meetings in accordance with Government Code section 54953(e) and other applicable provisions of the Brown Act.

Section 4. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption and shall be effective until the earlier of (i) thirty days from its adoption, or (ii) such time the Board of Directors adopts a subsequent resolution in accordance with Government Code section 54953(e)(3) to extend the time during which the legislative bodies of West Bay Sanitary District may continue to teleconference without compliance with paragraph (3) of subdivision (b) of section 54953.

"PRELIMINARY REVIEW"

20 Shoshone Place, Portola Valley, California – Grinder Pump System January 30, 2023

INTRODUCTION. At the February 8, 2023, District Board Meeting, the Board will consider the approval of the Class 3 sewer permit for the construction of a Grinder pump system for the Lands of Davidson; and the authorization for the filing of a California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) "Notice of Exemption" for the project. This project is proposed by the property owner, Laura Davidson

.

<u>EXEMPTION REVIEW.</u> In compliance with CEQA Guidelines, this "preliminary review" of the Grinder System Project at 20 Shoshone Place, Portola Valley, California was conducted to determine whether the project is exempt from CEQA. Based on this review, staff has concluded that the project is exempt from CEQA under several sections of the guidelines. In summary, the project would not have any significant impacts on the environment because it includes little or no expansion of capacity, and will employ mitigation measures to alleviate any impacts.

This preliminary review presents and elaborates upon the rationale for the conclusions reached by staff.

Staff has concluded that all project elements are exempt under CEQA Guidelines section 15061(b)(3) (known as the "General Rule"), since it can be "seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activity in question may have a significant effect on the environment."

This certainty is based on the District's past experience with numerous sewer construction projects of this nature, and the mitigation measures included in all such projects to alleviate any impacts.

<u>Past Experience</u>. The District has completed many miles of sewer construction projects and pump station rehabilitation projects in residential areas throughout Menlo Park, Atherton, the County of San Mateo, and the Portola Valley area. While construction-related impacts on land use, traffic, noise, air quality, erosion, drainage, public safety, and cultural resources can occur, no <u>significant</u> environmental impacts have resulted from this work.

The reasons these have been "less-than-significant" include the short-term nature of construction activities, application of the District's standard construction mitigation measures, good community relations outreach programs to inform project area residents of construction activities, and active coordination with local jurisdictions.

<u>Construction Mitigation Measures</u>. Specific impact mitigation measures will be included in the proposed project to avoid, minimize, reduce, or rectify for construction-related impacts. These measures are used on all sewer construction projects. The measures address dust control; erosion control; noise control; protection of soils; provision for adequate drainage; protection and restoration of structures; precautions for working

near sensitive and unique vegetation, protection and restoration of vegetation, landscaping, and improvements; public health and safety precautions; community notifications; traffic control; and preservation of cultural resources.

Most project elements also are exempt as extension of utilities of a reasonable length to serve such construction.

Staff has concluded that most project elements are "categorically exempt" under CEQA Guidelines Section 15303 (a) (Single-family residences not in conjunction with the building of two or more units) and Section 15303 (d) (Water main, sewage, electrical, gas and other utility extensions of reasonable length to serve such construction).

This project is being implemented to provide sanitary sewer service to this parcel and remove the on-site septic system.

<u>CONCLUSION</u>. Based on the information presented herein, staff has concluded that all of the installation of the Grinder Pump System and force main extension is exempt from CEQA under the CEQA Guidelines Section15061(b)(3) (the General Rule), and that most project elements are also exempt under CEQA Guideline Section 15303(a) and (d).

1) Administrative:

a. The 2023 Master Plan consultant agreement was executed and a kick off meeting has been scheduled.

2) Finance:

- a. Staff met with the Finance Committee to discuss the District's ten year cash flow projections and met with the District investment team. A report will be given at the February 8, 2023 Regular Board Meeting.
- b. Revised applications were submitted to the State Water Board for the Bayfront Recycled Water Facility and the Avy Altschul Pump Station projects.
- c. The District received \$3,243,443.57 in a remnant payment from the County Tax Roll.

3) CIP Projects:

a. Construction Capital Improvement Program (CIP):

- i. The Bayfront Park Sewer Improvements Project was awarded to Ranger Pipelines Inc. and final permitting is being obtained before beginning construction.
- ii. The final replacement of two pipeline segments in an easement at Alberni Street and Menalto Avenue in East Palo Alto were completed.

b. Levee Improvement Project:

i. The United States Army Corps of Engineers' (USACE) and the Bay Conservation and Development Commission supplied the District "conditions of approval" so that the bid process can begin.

4) Information Technology (IT):

a. Staff will begin migrating to Microsoft Office 365 in early 2023.

5) Operations and Maintenance:

a. Collection System:

i. The crew assisted Los Altos Hills with a Sanitary Sewer Overflow (SSO) where a sewer pipeline which crossed a creek failed because of erosion.

b. Pump Facilities:

i. During the January 25th Board Meeting, the Pump Supervisor and Superintendent presented on the ISAC System, which uses telephone lines and dial-up modems to communicate alarms but will no longer be supported. They presented solutions to mitigate the issue.

c. Training:

i. Staff will receive training on the updated COVID-19 Response Plan.

6) Water Quality:

a. Sharon Heights Golf and Country Club (SHGCC):

 The West Bay/SHGCC facility produced 5 million gallons for the month of January, however, 0 gallons were received by the Club. The plant is at minimal levels of production.

b. Bayfront Recycled Water Facility (BRWF):

i. An agreement was sent to Meta regarding the Project Management.

c. Woodside Recycled Water Facility (BRWF):

 The Woodside Recycled Water Facility feasibility is underway. Pass through invoices are being payed to Woodard and Curran but reimbursed by Menlo Country Club as part of the feasibility agreement.

7) Fleet and Facilities:

a. Vehicle Maintenance:

i. The District new half inch hydro jetter has been outfitted with traffic control lights, a radio, and a purple pipe fill inlet so it may use recycled water.

8) Personnel:

- i. The recruitment for the Project Manager position was successful. The new Project Manager was introduced at the January 25th Board Meeting.
- ii. The Associate Engineering position will go out for recruitment once again.

9) Upcoming Events:

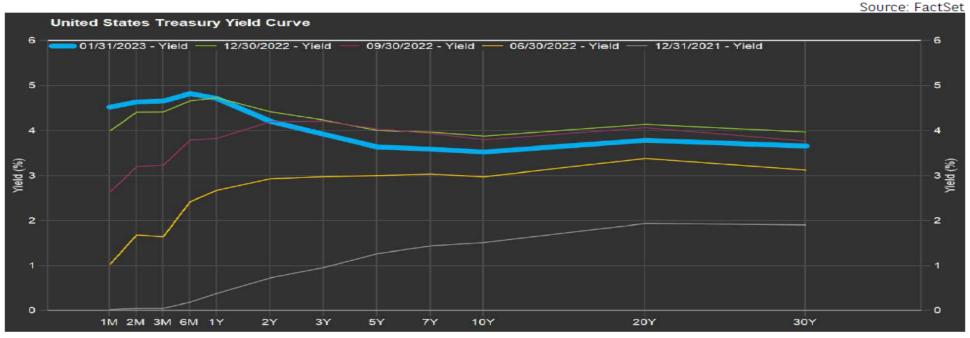

- Cash additions in December 2022 were deployed to 2025 & 2026 maturity dates, increasing modified duration to 1.57 years.
- Yield to Worst is now lower than in December because of the inverted yield curve: three- to four-year maturities yield LESS than shorter term bonds, but will do so for a longer time.
- The goal of adding these longer maturity dates is to avoid Reinvestment Risk –
 i.e., the risk that yields available on the maturity of an asset might be
 disappointing due to market conditions at that time.

Yield Curves



- The inversion of the US Treasury has deepened since the end of 2022, with a decline of 36 bps for the three
 year maturity: WBSD got a better deal buying in December when yields were higher. Short Term yields under
 one year in maturity have, conversely, gone up.
- A curve of this shape is often associated with expectations for a recession, in response to which the
 combination of Fed policy and investors flocking to the safe haven of US Treasuries will likely drive rates lower
 across the curve: WBSD will be happy to have some longer dated maturities if that is the case.

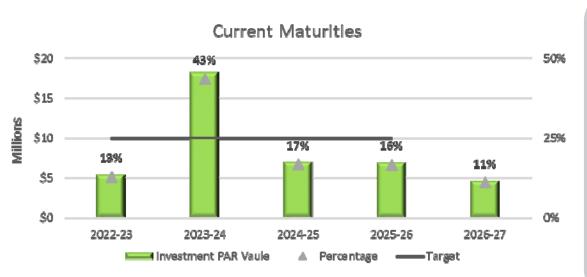

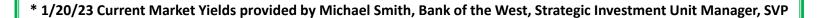


Finance Committee Fiscal Year 2022-23 12/31/22











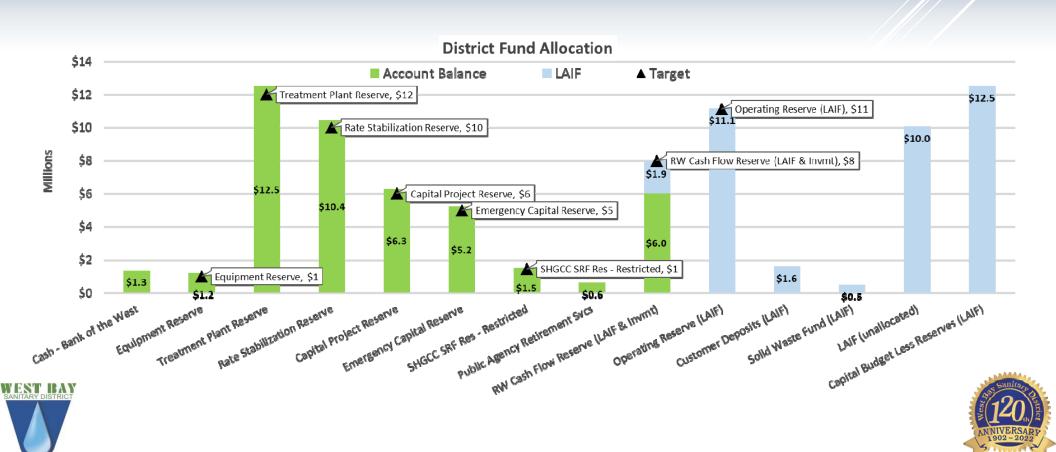

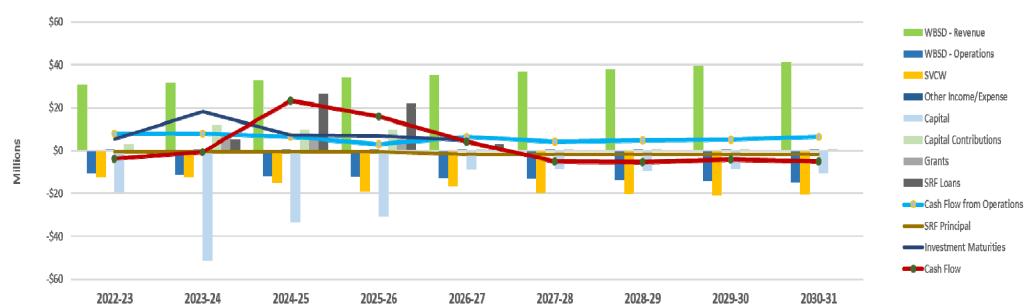

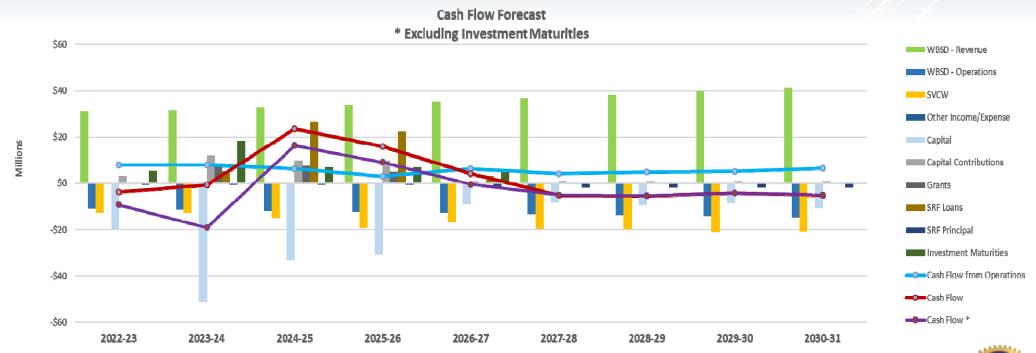
Cash Flow Forecast

Subject: Consideration to Approve the District Reserve Policy

Background

On October 13, 2010, the Board designated Bank of the West as the District's Investment Advisor and authorized the District Manager (now GM) to transfer to and from Bank of the West Investment Management & Trust funds designated by the District Board as long-term investment funds. The reserves are managed by Bank of the West on behalf of the District.

Reserves were established to facilitate efficient district operations, capital expenditures, or as required by regulations or agreement and provide for known future funding needs and emergencies.

The Finance Committee met on June 2, 2021 to reviewed the Reserve Policy and discuss proposed changes, which were approved by the full board on June 9, 2021. The following policy revisions are recommended.

- Increase Capital Project Reserve to \$8 million, from \$6 million.
- Increase Emergency Capital Reserve to \$6 million, from \$5 million.
- Reallocate current year budget contributions to fulfill new targets.

The Reserve policy targets were revised and some language was clarified on reserves, procedures for using reserves, and update procedures for monitoring reserves levels.

Fiscal Impact

There is no immediate fiscal impact. The reserve contributions in the approved budget for FY 2022-23 of \$3,951,718 are reallocated to achieve the new target balances.

Reserves for capital projects is increasing to reflect higher costs. Preparing for future large cash flow needs allows the District to manage funds efficiently, save interest by avoiding future debt, and manage rate increases more smoothly.

The current reserve targets were achieved after transferring \$10 million on December 20, 2022, as approved by the board on December 14, 2022.

The Vehicle and Equipment Reserve does not reflect any current vehicle purchases. There is \$762,500 in the FY 2022-23 approved budget. Some vehicles will not be available in the current year and will be carried over to FY 2023-24.

The following is a list of the reserve contribution budget, with proposed revisions and account balances as of December 31, 2022, total reserve after transfers, and the revised targets in the Reserve Policy.

Recommendation

West Bay Sanitary District Reserve Policy

(Approved June 9, 2021 (Revised February 8, 2023)

PURPOSE

West Bay Sanitary District (District) shall maintain reserves in the General and Capital Asset Funds to establish levels of reserves necessary for maintaining the District's credit worthiness and adequately providing for:

- Funding infrastructure replacement.
- Economic uncertainties and other financial hardships.
- Loss of significant revenue sources such as property tax receipts or connection fees.
- Local disasters, catastrophic events.
- Future debt or capital obligations.
- Cash flow requirements
- Unfunded mandates including costly regulatory requirements.

POLICY

Operating Reserves — (General Fund)

The amount of operating reserves will equal six months of operating expenses. Funds are earmarked specifically for the operating expenses and are equal to six months of budgeted total expenses (excluding depreciation) for that year. The key objective for this reserve is to provide adequate cash flow from July through December, when the District does not receive revenue from sewer service charges.

The Rate Stabilization Reserve (RSR) was established in FY2015-16 to build a reserve to stabilize future rate increases. As approved by the Board through the budget approval process, contributions are made to the reserve. The target for the RSR is established at \$10M.

The Treatment Plant Reserve (TPR) has been established to assist in stabilizing rates due to future treatment plant needs. The target level for this reserve is \$12M.

The District established a Public Agency Retirement Services (PARS) Trust, with separate Other Post-Employment Benefits (OPEB) and Pension funds. The funds are administered by PARS for the purpose of pre-funding pension and retirement benefit liabilities. These reserves are irrevocable trusts as defined by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS). PARS uses mutual fund earnings to accumulate interest and gains which can be used for payment of liabilities for PERS retirement and OPEB costs.

Capital Asset Fund

The Capital Projects Reserves (CPR) will be accumulated to fund infrastructure projects and will be an integral part of the District's capital improvement plan documented in its Ten-Year Capital Improvement Master Plan. A key objective for accumulating capital reserves is to minimize potential external borrowing and interest expenses. The target for the CPR is \$8M6 million.

The Emergency Capital Reserve (ECR) was established to cover cash flow requirements in the event of catastrophic or local disasters. It is considered fully funded at a target level of \$65M.

The Equipment Replacement Reserve (ERR) was established to stabilize expenditures for purchases of large equipment and vehicles. This reserve was initially funded with \$215,000 in FY2015-16. Contributions are added annually through the budget process with by 3% COLA. The ERR has a target of \$1M; the balance maycan fluctuate depending on equipment needs.

The Recycled Water Facility Reserve (RWFR) was established with \$8M with the specific objective to fund expenditure requirements of Recycled Water Projects, such as, Sharon Heights and Bayfront. The reserve is used while awaiting reimbursement from the California State Revolving Fund (SRF) or project partners. No further additions to this fund are anticipated. Upon completion of the projects the reserves could be reallocated per Board direction to the General Fund.

Recycled Water Fund

Restricted reserves may be setup and maintained to support agreements with District partners. The Sharon Heights Recycled Water Facility Reserve is a restricted reserve to hold funds of Sharon Heights Golf and Country Club as required by their long-term agreement as a security deposit for the SRF loan. The balance is dictated by the terms of their agreement.

PROCEDURE FOR USING RESERVE FUNDS

Operating Reserves

Operating Reserves can be used to meet cash flow requirements of District operations. Authority to use the funds will be consistent with the District's fiscal policies, annual Approved Budget, and Purchasing Policy.

Capital Reserves

The Board of Directors will authorize use of Capital Reserves during the budget process. Authorization for the use of Capital Reserves for unplanned capital replacement will be consistent with the District's fiscal policies, including the Purchasing Policy. Capital Reserve are subject to Board approval prior to their use.

PARS Trust

The Board of Directors may authorize the use of interest and/or principal from the PARS Trust towards the District's OPEB and PERS Unfunded Accrued Liability (UAL) or current pension liabilities. This accountfund is an irrevocable trust and is strictly for the use of paying the District's Other Post-Employment Benefits and pension liabilities. This accountfund has no requirement to be used in any fiscal year and can accumulate to the level desired by the Board to be used at a future date. The fund may be used to offset employer contributions and help stabilize annual pension fluctuations.

PROCEDURE FOR MONITORING RESERVE LEVELS

A reserve analysis is submitted to the Board upon the occurrence of the following events:

- Monthly Financial Analysis Reports are provided to the Board showing all receipts, distributions, and transfers for the previous month from the General account.
- Monthly summary Investment Portfolio Statements, for all investment accounts, are provided to the Board for the previous month.
- Quarterly <u>Treasury</u> reports of <u>all account and</u> reserve balances and performance are submitted to the Board of Directors for their review and approval.
- Board of Directors reviews target levels of reserves during deliberation of the annual budget. Reserves are reviewed to determine if levels are still adequate and to-keeping up with inflation.
- Board of Director deliberation of a sewer service charge rate increase.
- A major change in conditions threatens the reserve levels established within this policy.

If the analysis indicates projected or actual reserve levels falling 10% below or above the levels outlined in this policy, at least one of the following actions shall be included with the analysis:

- An explanation of why the reserve levels are not at the targeted level.
- An identified course of action to bring reserve levels within the minimum and maximum levels prescribed.
