He reported staff are preparing an invoice for Silicon Valley Clean Water for use of the emergency pond at the Flow Equalization Facility (FEF.) He also reported the City of East Palo Alto is conducting a request for qualifications for operation and maintenance services. He reported the Construction Inspector's vehicle was totaled when a tree fell on it during recent storm events. General Manager Ramirez continued to report the Clerical Assistant's 18-month long project is complete and her last day will be April 4<sup>th</sup>. He reported there is still a considerable amount of material to scan in storage at the FEF. The next regular Board meetings will be April 12<sup>th</sup> and April 26<sup>th</sup>. The Budget Workshop will be held on May 3<sup>rd</sup>. <u>Discussion/Comments</u>: General Manager Ramirez reported negotiations are underway with the Los Lomitas School District regarding an easement on their property for the Avy/Altschul Pump Station. The project will be funded by a \$950,000 SRF loan which includes 3A-2

approximately \$333,000 in a grant. An agreement to pay back the SRF is being prepared by the District's General Counsel with Sharon Heights Golf Club. Construction is expected to begin June 15<sup>th</sup> when school is out of session.

### 10. Discussion and Direction on Bayfront Recycled Water Project and Status Update

<u>Discussion/Comments</u>: General Manager Ramirez reported SCWA will begin to monitor the habitat and wildlife at the site location. He also reported the project management agreement has been received from Meta/Signature Group in the amount of \$951,000 of which Meta will pay \$409,000. He stated the District is working with the City of Menlo Park for an encroachment permit for the levee.

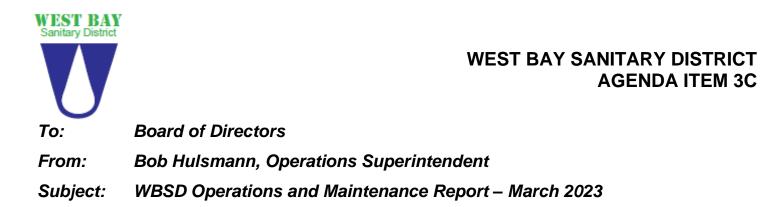

### Subject: Bank of the West Monthly Investment Portfolio Statements

### **Background**

In October 2010 the District named Bank of the West as the District's Investment advisor and approved an investment of \$5 million in available funds to establish the Emergency Capital Reserve. Subsequently, the Board has established several additional reserves to provide financial stability for the District. On June 9, 2021, the Board approved the Operating Reserve increase to six months of operations, based on the current budget, held in the Local Agency Investment Fund (LAIF), in order to have the funds more accessible. This is necessary, as Operating Reserves are intended to fund the District between July 1<sup>st</sup> and December each year, when the County of San Mateo delivers the first installment of sewer service charges collected through tax rolls, which accounts for the majority of funding. On February 8, 2023, the Board approved the current Reserve Policy, which increased the Capital Projects and Emergency Capital Reserves by \$2 and \$1 million, respectively.

Excess funds over the current monthly expenditures are held in Local Agency Investment Fund (LAIF), which are equivalent to cash and may earn higher yields without a long term commitment. Operating Reserves, customer deposits, current capital projects, and Solid Waste Funds are held in LAIF.

Restricted funds for Sharon Heights Golf & Country Club (SHGCC), as required for the Clean Water State Revolving Fund (SRF) loan are held in a separate account.

There are currently five separate investment reserves maintained to support the goals of the District, along with reserves held in LAIF, the Vehicle & Equipment Reserve held in a money market account, and the restricted Pension Trust and Recycled Water State Revolving Fund (SRF) Reserves. Annual contributions are made in accordance with the Board approved budget in order to reach the target balances for each reserve.

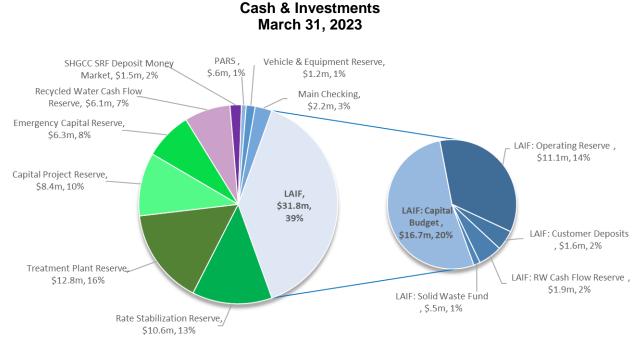

### Fiscal Impact

The District has approximately \$81.7 million in all reserve and bank accounts as of March 31, 2023, including restricted funds. There was \$3.95 million in transfers in the approved FY 2022-23 Budget. The Board approved additional transfers on June 22, 2022, December 14, 2022, and February 8, 2023, for a total of \$15.2 million in transfers in FY 2022-23.

Effective July 1, 2022, the Operating Reserve target increased to \$11.1 million for six months of operations, based on the approved budget for Fiscal Year 2022-23. As of March 31, 2023, all reserves have achieved the target balance of \$58.6 thousand. Due to fluctuations in market values, variances with the target balances vary, however principal is recovered as investments are held through maturity.



The monthly statement synopsis indicating the amount of each reserve fund the District holds in the Bank of the West Investment Portfolios are attached. Quarterly Treasury Reports will include details of investments of each reserve account.

### **Recommendation**

The Finance Manager recommends the District Board accept the Investment Portfolio Statements by affirming and approving the items listed in the Consent Calendar.

### 1) Administrative:

- a. Staff met with Barker and Wagoner Architects to discuss the design of a new maintenance building. Barker and Wagoner Architects is preparing a proposal that would design a new maintenance building and will include cost estimates for construction. The design cost was approved in the FY22/23 budget.
- b. Staff has updated the General Code of Regulations, Standard Specifications, and Detail Drawings. General Counsel will review the items before staff brings it to the Board.
- c. The District will have a public outreach booth at the City of Menlo Park Easter Egg Hunt on Saturday, April 8<sup>th</sup>.

### 2) Finance:

- a. 0 Alpine Road requested a refund of the supplemental connection fee and standard sewer connection fee for approximately \$28,000. The property owners will not be moving forward with the project as planned and will be selling the property.
- b. The Meta finance agreement was signed. The agreement provides for 43.3 percent reimbursement for the Project Management costs by Meta.

### 3) CIP Projects:

### a. Construction Capital Improvement Program (CIP):

i. The Bayfront Park Sewer Improvements Project was awarded to Ranger Pipelines Inc. and will begin as materials are secured in the next month.

### b. Levee Improvement Project:

- i. The Levee Improvement Project received permit approval by the Bay Conservation Development Commission on April 6, 2023, during its public meeting.
- ii. The City of Menlo Park approved the Levee Improvement Project encroachment agreement at the April 4, 2023, Council Meeting.

### 4) Information Technology (IT):

- a. Staff is working with Streamline on the new website. Roll out of the new site is scheduled for July 1, 2023.
- b. Staff successfully migrated to Microsoft Office 365 on March 29, 2023.

### a. Collection System:

i. Crews responded to numerous power outages during the recent storms. Generators came on-line automatically as intended. Crews had to top off fuel to the generators as needed during the prolonged outages.

i. The Pump Supervisor and Superintendent continue to research the replacement options for the outdated telemetry ISAC System and will report during the May 3<sup>rd</sup> budget workshop.

### c. Training:

 Staff and the General Manager will attend the California Water Environment Association's Annual Conference in San Diego for the first time in three years. The conference will be held from April 19<sup>th</sup> though April 21<sup>st</sup>.

### 6) Water Quality:

### a. Sharon Heights Golf and Country Club (SHGCC):

i. The bid packet for the Avy Altschul Pump Station Project is being prepared and should be out for bids by April 15<sup>th</sup>.

### b. Bayfront Recycled Water Facility (BRWF):

i. Project Management and Design has begun and should take approximately six months to be at the 30% design stage. The Recycled Water Committee will be asked to help select the Design Build Team to construct the facility. The project is expected to deliver recycled water by Q1 2026. A kick off meeting is scheduled for the week of April 9<sup>th</sup>.

### c. Woodside Recycled Water Facility (BRWF):

i. The Woodside Recycled Water Facility feasibility will conclude soon. A full report will be brought to the District Board by Woodard & Curran.

### 7) Fleet and Facilities:

### a. Vehicle Maintenance:

i. CSRMA approved a \$15,000.00 payout for the District Inspector's pickup truck which was struck by a fallen tree.

### 8) Personnel:

 The Associate Engineering recruitment went well and an offer has been accepted by one of the candidates. We hope to bring our new Associate Engineer on by May 1<sup>st</sup>.

### 9) Upcoming Events:

a. Next Regular Board Meetings: Wednesdays, April 12<sup>th</sup> and April 22<sup>nd</sup>.

### 10) Misc. Items:

## Subject: Consider Approving Closing of Andrighetto Reimbursement Agreement

### Background

On January 28, 2002 the District entered into a reimbursement agreement with Domenic Andrighetto, Alison Krausz, and Michael Scandalios for a sewer main extension to 235, 234, and 225 Shawnee Pass. The District reviewed the costs of the sewer main extension and determined that \$84,618 was eligible for reimbursement, as approved by the board on February 11, 2002 by adoption of Resolution 1471 (2002).

The original terms of the agreement will be fulfilled by the District after final payments are issued for 4 Navajo Place, 130 Shawnee Pass, 193 Meadowood Road, 20 Shoshone Place, for connections 21.85, 23.25, 24.25, and 25.25, respectively, with \$367.72 remaining on the total \$84,618 eligible for reimbursement.

The District will notify all parties, with final payments it has fulfilled its full obligation under the Agreement and the Agreement will be closed.

### Fiscal Impact

The District has issued \$80,488.30 between 2002 and 2022 to the original contract parties, with \$4,129.70 remaining eligible reimbursement, per the agreement and \$3,761.98 outstanding on the 4.4 connections to the parties named above.

Options to Close Agreement:

- 1. Close agreement after current outstanding connections are completed and reimbursed. This will require a public hearing, per the agreement.
- 2. Keep open until additional connection is made and charge remaining balance on agreement or January 28, 2027, expiration date of contract, whichever comes first.
- 3. District pays remaining \$367.72 (\$122.57 each) to the three parties named in agreement, with current outstanding reimbursements, when completed, to fulfill complete eligible reimbursement, per the agreement.

### **Recommendation**

The Finance Manager recommends the District Board approve the closing of the reimbursement agreement with Domenic Andrighetto, Alison Krausz, and Michael Scandalios.

# REIMBURSEMENT AGREEMENT LANDS OF ANDRIGHETTO, KRAUSZ, AND SCANDALIOS 235, 234, and 225 SHAWNEE PASS, PORTOLA VALLEY

This Agreement is entered into this <u>28th</u> day of <u>January</u>, <u>2002</u>, by and between the WEST BAY SANITARY DISTRICT, a public agency, hereinafter referred to as "District" and DOMENIC ANDRIGHETTO, ALISON KRAUSZ, AND MICHAEL SCANDALIOS, the other persons executing this Agreement, hereinafter referred to as "Developer."

## RECITALS

A. Developer pursued and completed development activities on certain real property located in the territory of District and more particularly described in Exhibit "A" attached hereto ("the Real Property") for which it has been necessary for Developer to construct and install, at Developer's expense, certain wastewater collection and transmission facilities (the "Wastewater Facilities") to serve the development. The Wastewater Facilities are more particularly described in Exhibit "B" attached hereto.

B. The Wastewater Facilities are complete and on <u>January 28, 2002</u> they were accepted by District and are now public property of District. The Wastewater Facilities have the potential to serve and benefit persons in the District in addition to those persons who may occupy the Real Property.

C. Because persons other than those who may occupy the Real Property may be served and benefited by the Wastewater Facilities, the parties agree that such persons should be required to reimburse Developer for their proportionate share of Developer's cost to construct and install the Wastewater Facilities.

D. District has reviewed the costs incurred by Developer and has determined that the total sum of Eighty four Thousand Six Hundred Eighteen Dollars (\$ 84,618.00) is eligible for reimbursement pursuant to the following Terms and Conditions of this Agreement.

In consideration of the foregoing Recitals and the following Terms and Conditions, District and Developer agree as follows:

## **TERMS AND CONDITIONS**

#### 1. Supplemental Connection Charge

a. In addition to the usual connection charges imposed by the District upon connection to the District's wastewater system, the District shall also impose a "Supplemental Connection Charge" for each connection to the Wastewater Facilities by any of the following persons (referred to in this Agreement as "Connectors"):

(1) Any person, other than Developer, who makes an initial connection to the Wastewater Facilities;

(2) Any person, other than Developer, who makes one or more additional connections to the Wastewater Facilities;

(3) Any person, other than Developer, who increases the discharge of wastewater through an existing connection to the Wastewater Facilities if that discharge exceeds the person's authorized discharge entitlement; and

(4) Developer, if Developer either (a) makes one or more additional connections to the Wastewater Facilities, or (b) increases the discharge of wastewater through an existing connection to the Wastewater Facilities so that the resulting discharge exceeds the Developer's authorized discharge entitlement; provided, however, that in either of the foregoing cases, the Supplemental Connection Charge otherwise payable by Developer will be waived if (a) there have been no prior connections to the Wastewater Facilities other than connections made by Developer, and (b) Developer executes an amendment to this Agreement in form and content acceptable to District which makes an appropriate adjustment in the "Cp" factor attributable to Developer.

For purposes of this Agreement, a connection includes both a connection of a building sewer to the Wastewater Facilities and a connection of an upstream sewer extension to the Wastewater Facilities.

b. Subject to the provisions of subparagraph 1.c. below, the amount of the Supplemental Connection Charge payable by each Connector shall be computed in accordance with the following formula:

 $SCC = \frac{ERC \times Cn \times (ENRC/ENRI)}{Cp + Cn}$ 

Where:

SCC = The Supplemental Connection Charge to be paid by the new Connector.

ERC = The total eligible reimbursable cost specified in Recital D of this Agreement.

Cp = A factor representing the total wastewater contribution of all previous Connectors to the Wastewater Facilities measured in SFDE pursuant to subparagraph 1.d. below.

Cn = A factor representing the wastewater contribution of the new Connector to the Wastewater Facilities measured in SFDE pursuant to subparagraph 1.d. below.

ENRC = The ENR Construction Cost Index, rounded to the nearest whole number, for the month in which payment of the supplemental connection charge is made by the new connector.

ENRI = The ENR Construction Cost Index for the month in which the Wastewater

Facilities were accepted by the District. ENRI shall be 6390.

c. Under no circumstances shall the amount of the Supplemental Connection Charge payable by a Connector exceed the estimated cost of constructing wastewater facilities from the Connector's property to the point where the Wastewater Facilities constructed by Developer connect to District's system. For this purpose, the estimated cost shall be determined by District.

d. Prior to the approval of a new connection to the Wastewater Facilities, the District Manager shall determine and establish the contribution of wastewater expected to be generated by the new Connector, measured in terms of single family dwelling equivalents ("SFDE"). Each single family dwelling unit shall be assigned a factor of 1 SFDE. All other uses shall be assigned an equivalency factor which is representative of the contribution of wastewater expected to be generated by the particular use. The equivalency factor shall take into account the volume of wastewater flows expected to be produced by the Connector and any other characteristics of the Connector's wastewater which may have an impact on the Wastewater Facilities. However, in no event shall any Connector be assigned an equivalency factor of less than 1 SFDE.

e. For purposes of this Agreement the amount of Cp attributable to Developer's wastewater contribution shall be <u>3</u> SFDE.

#### 2. Collection of Supplemental Connection Charges

a. District shall use its best efforts to collect Supplemental Connection charges from all persons who become obligated to pay them. However, District may postpone or waive, in whole or in part, collection of any such charges if, after reasonable notice and hearing, the District Board, in the exercise of reasonable discretion, makes one of the following determinations:

- (1) Acting pursuant to Health and Safety Code Section 6520.6, the District Board determines the amount is too small to justify the cost of collection; or
- (2) The District Board determines that in the interest of the public health, safety and welfare, collection of the amount is not justified; or
- (3) The District Board determines that collection of the amount would pose an undue financial hardship on the new Connector.

If such a determination is made by the District Board, the determination shall be binding, and neither Developer, Connectors or any other person shall have a claim against District by reason of District's failure to collect any amount which is the subject of such a determination.

b. District's obligation to collect Supplemental Connection Charges shall cease upon the first of the following events to occur:

(1) The lapse of twenty-five (25) years from the date of District's approval and acceptance of the Wastewater Facilities; or

(2) At any time District no longer has the legal authority to collect these charges.

c. Nothing in this Agreement shall be interpreted to require District to allow connections to be made to the Wastewater Facilities. Connections may be denied by District under any circumstances including, but not limited to the following:

- (1) District does not have sufficient capacity to serve the proposed connection(s); or
- (2) District is precluded by law from allowing the connection(s); or
- (3) The proposed connection(s) are not in compliance with established policies and regulations of District.

## 3. Reimbursement

a. For purposes of this paragraph 3, the persons to whom reimbursement shall be made by District are referred to as "Reimbursees."

b. The following persons are Reimbursees and shall be entitled to reimbursement as provided in this paragraph 3:

- (1) Developer; and
- (2) Prior Connectors who have paid Supplemental Connection Charges.

c. Except as provided in subparagraph 3.d. below, as Supplemental Connection Charges are collected from each new Connector for each new connection, District shall credit the account of each Reimbursee with a proportionate share of the charges collected based upon the ratio which each Reimbursee's discharge entitlement, measured in SFDEs, bears to the total of all wastewater discharge entitlements, measured in SFDEs, for all Reimbursees, less District's reasonable administrative cost to make the collection and reimbursement of the Supplemental Connection Charge.

d. In the case of any prior Connector who is a Reimbursee pursuant to subparagraph 3.b. above but who, pursuant to the provisions of subparagraph 2.a. of this Agreement, has not been required by the District to pay the full Supplemental Connection Charge which otherwise should have been imposed, such a connector shall be entitled to reimbursement, but only to the extent provided in this subparagraph. In calculating such a Connector's reimbursement amount pursuant to subparagraph 3.c. above, the Connector's wastewater discharge entitlement shall be discounted in the same ratio as the amount of the Supplemental Connection Charge which the connector should have paid except for the effect of the provisions of subparagraph 2.a.

e. Payment of amounts credited will be made by District within a reasonable time

after Supplemental Connection Charges are collected.

f. In the absence of written instructions in form and substance acceptable to District, District's reimbursement obligations to any Reimbursee shall be deemed fully satisfied upon sending the reimbursement payment(s) to the Developer and, if applicable, to prior Connectors, who paid the Supplemental Connection Charge to the addresses shown for such persons in District's records. Each Reimbursee shall be responsible to inform the District of any changes. If District becomes aware that a dispute exists regarding the identity of the person to whom the payment is due, District may withhold the payment until the dispute is resolved to District's satisfaction.

A Reimbursee may assign the Reimbursee's reimbursement rights under this Agreement; provided, however, that insofar as District's rights and obligations are concerned, any such assignment shall be effective only if (1) District is provided with evidence, satisfactory to District, of the regularity and authenticity of the assignment and (2) the parties to the assignment have executed and delivered to District instruments in form and substance satisfactory to District which relieve District from any liability or obligation by reason of District's reliance upon and performance of its duties in conformity with the provisions of the assignment.

g. Interest shall not accrue on any funds collected and held for the account of persons pursuant to the provisions of this Agreement, and no person shall have a claim against District for interest on such funds; provided, however, that the provisions of this subparagraph do not preclude application of the interest factor provided for in subparagraph 1.b. above.

#### 4. Connectors' Approval of Agreement

As a condition of the District's approval of any connection to the Wastewater Facilities, the District may require a Connector to execute an instrument, in form and substance acceptable to District, which evidences Connector's acknowledgment of the Terms and Conditions of this Agreement and consent to be bound thereby.

#### 5. Miscellaneous Provisions

a. This Agreement constitutes the entire understanding and agreement between the parties.

b. This Agreement may not be modified or amended except by a further written agreement executed by all parties who are signatories hereto.

c. This Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties, their assigns, personal representatives and successors in interest.

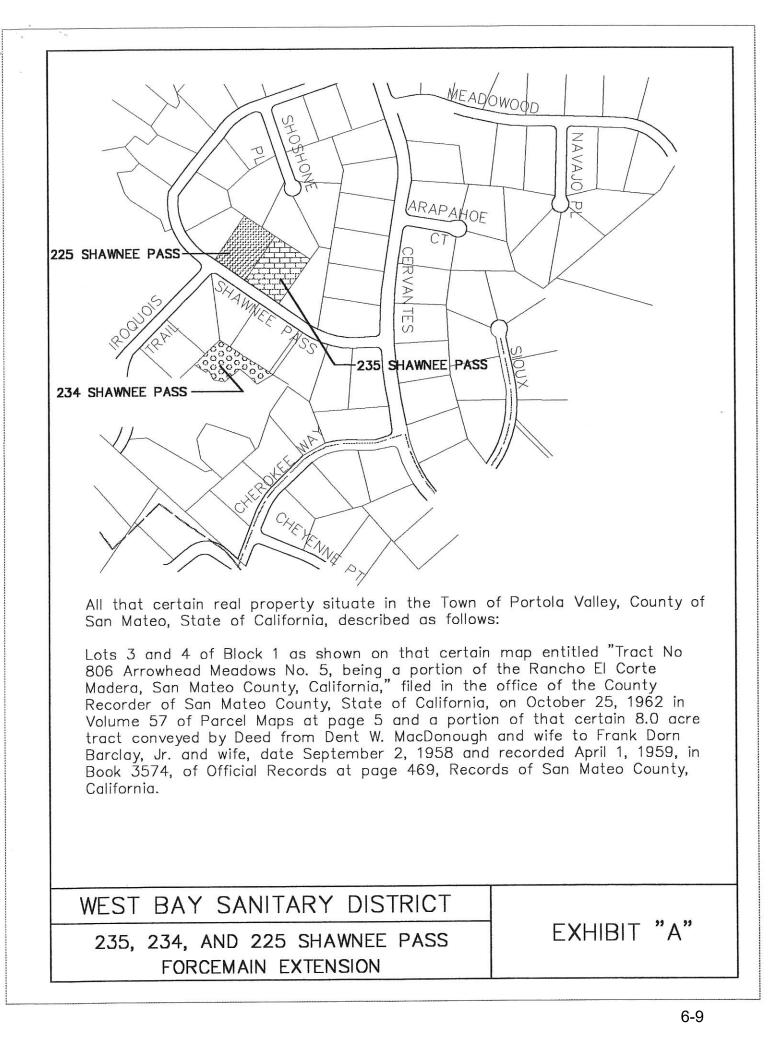

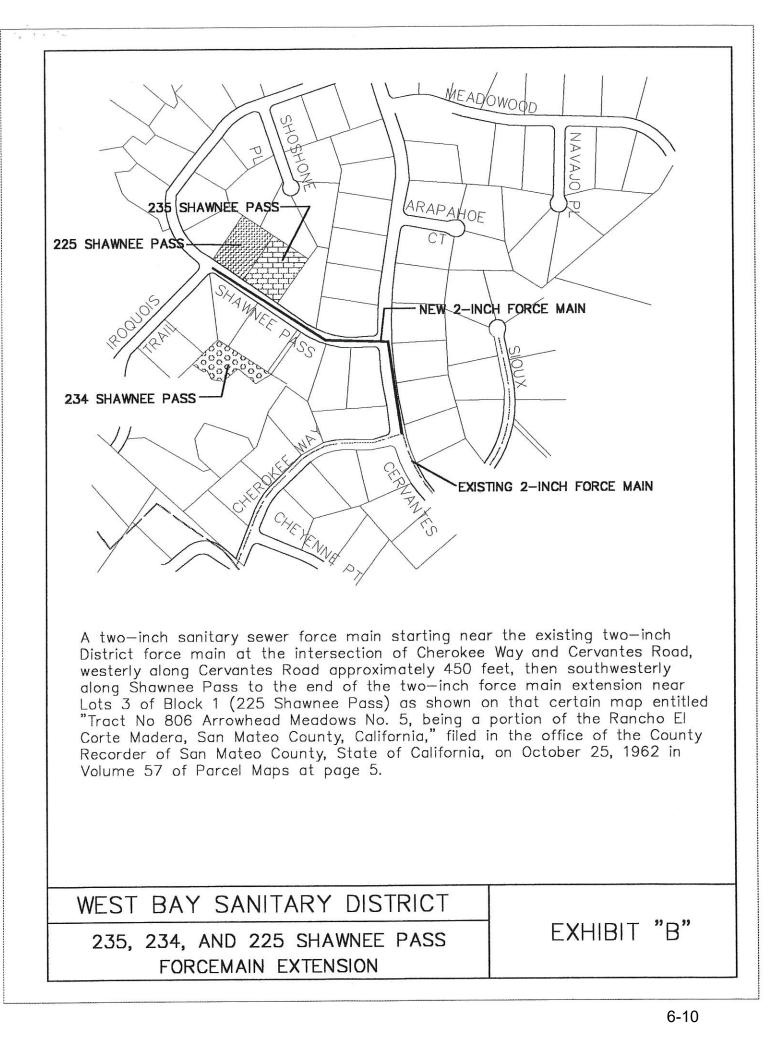

# Subject: Consider Approving Closing of Boyce Reimbursement Agreement

# <u>Background</u>

On July 12, 2004 the District entered into a reimbursement agreement with Richard Boyce, Sandy Boyce, Alan Denenberg, Lauren Denenberg, Andrew Waddell, Kathy Waddell, William Thomas, Susan Thomas, Ramon Villareal, and Kelly Villareal for sewer main extension to 420, 440, 455, and 460 Cervantes Road and 130 Meadowood Drive, which was completed October 28, 2002. The District reviewed the costs and determined that \$99,990 was eligible for reimbursement and approved by the Board on July 12, 2004 by Resolution 1545 (2004).

The original terms of the agreement will be fulfilled by the District after final payments are issued for 193 Meadowood Drive and 460 Cervantes Road, connections 13 and 13.4, respectively, for the total \$99,990 eligible for reimbursement.

The District will notify all parties that, with final payments, it has fulfilled its full obligation under the Agreement and the Agreement will be closed.

## Fiscal Impact

The District has issued \$89,642.34 between 2005 and 2022 to the original contract parties, with \$10,347.70 eligible reimbursement, per the agreement on the two outstanding connections, for a total of \$99,990.04 to the parties named above.

#### **Recommendation**

The Finance Manager recommends the District Board approve the closing of the reimbursement agreement with Richard Boyce, Sandy Boyce, Alan Denenberg, Lauren Denenberg, Andrew Waddell, Kathy Waddell, William Thomas, Susan Thomas, Ramon Villareal, and Kelly Villareal.

# REIMBURSEMENT AGREEMENT LANDS OF BOYCE, DENENBERG, WADDELL, THOMAS AND VILLAREAL 420, 440, 460, AND 455 CERVANTES ROAD AND 130 MEADOWOOD ROAD, PORTOLA VALLEY

This Agreement is entered into this <u>12TH</u> day of <u>JULY</u>, 2004, by and between the WEST BAY SANITARY DISTRICT, a public agency, hereinafter referred to as "District" and RICHARD BOYCE, SANDY BOYCE, ALAN DENENBERG, LAUREN DENENBERG, ANDREW WADDELL, KATHY WADDELL, WILLIAM THOMAS, SUSAN THOMAS, RAMON VILLAREAL, AND KELLY VILLAREAL, the other persons executing this Agreement, hereinafter referred to as "Developer."

# RECITALS

A. Developer pursued and completed development activities on certain real property located in the territory of District and more particularly described in Exhibit "A" attached hereto ("the Real Property") for which it has been necessary for Developer to construct and install, at Developer's expense, certain wastewater collection and transmission facilities (the "Wastewater Facilities") to serve the development. The Wastewater Facilities are more particularly described in Exhibit "B" attached hereto.

B. The Wastewater Facilities are complete and on October 28, 2002, they were accepted by District and are now public property of District. The Wastewater Facilities have the potential to serve and benefit persons in the District in addition to those persons who may occupy the Real Property.

C. Because persons other than those who may occupy the Real Property may be served and benefited by the Wastewater Facilities, the parties agree that such persons should be required to reimburse Developer for their proportionate share of Developer's cost to construct and install the Wastewater Facilities.

D. District has reviewed the costs incurred by Developer and has determined that the total sum of Ninety nine Thousand Nine Hundred Ninety Dollars (\$ 99,990.00) is eligible for reimbursement pursuant to the following Terms and Conditions of this Agreement.

In consideration of the foregoing Recitals and the following Terms and Conditions, District and Developer agree as follows:

# TERMS AND CONDITIONS

## 1. Supplemental Connection Charge

a. In addition to the usual connection charges imposed by the District upon connection to the District's wastewater system, the District shall also impose a "Supplemental Connection Charge" for each connection to the Wastewater Facilities by any of the following persons (referred to in this Agreement as "Connectors"): (1) Any person, other than Developer, who makes an initial connection to the Wastewater Facilities;

(2) Any person, other than Developer, who makes one or more additional connections to the Wastewater Facilities;

(3) Any person, other than Developer, who increases the discharge of wastewater through an existing connection to the Wastewater Facilities if that discharge exceeds the person's authorized discharge entitlement; and

(4) Developer, if Developer either (a) makes one or more additional connections to the Wastewater Facilities, or (b) increases the discharge of wastewater through an existing connection to the Wastewater Facilities so that the resulting discharge exceeds the Developer's authorized discharge entitlement; provided, however, that in either of the foregoing cases, the Supplemental Connection Charge otherwise payable by Developer will be waived if (a) there have been no prior connections to the Wastewater Facilities other than connections made by Developer, and (b) Developer executes an amendment to this Agreement in form and content acceptable to District which makes an appropriate adjustment in the "Cp" factor attributable to Developer.

For purposes of this Agreement, a connection includes both a connection of a building sewer to the Wastewater Facilities and a connection of an upstream sewer extension to the Wastewater Facilities.

b. Subject to the provisions of subparagraph 1.c. below, the amount of the Supplemental Connection Charge payable by each Connector shall be computed in accordance with the following formula:

 $SCC = \frac{ERC \times Cn \times (ENRC/ENRI)}{Cp + Cn}$ 

Where:

SCC = The Supplemental Connection Charge to be paid by the new Connector.

ERC = The total eligible reimbursable cost specified in Recital D of this Agreement.

Cp = A factor representing the total wastewater contribution of all previous Connectors to the Wastewater Facilities measured in SFDE pursuant to subparagraph 1.d. below.

Cn = A factor representing the wastewater contribution of the new Connector to the Wastewater Facilities measured in SFDE pursuant to subparagraph 1.d. below.

ENRC = The ENR Construction Cost Index, rounded to the nearest whole number, for the month in which payment of the supplemental connection charge is made by

the new connector.

ENRI = The ENR Construction Cost Index for the month in which the Wastewater

Facilities were accepted by the District. ENRI shall be 6579.

c. Under no circumstances shall the amount of the Supplemental Connection Charge payable by a Connector exceed the estimated cost of constructing wastewater facilities from the Connector's property to the point where the Wastewater Facilities constructed by Developer connect to District's system. For this purpose, the estimated cost shall be determined by District.

d. Prior to the approval of a new connection to the Wastewater Facilities, the District Manager shall determine and establish the contribution of wastewater expected to be generated by the new Connector, measured in terms of single family dwelling equivalents ("SFDE"). Each single family dwelling unit shall be assigned a factor of 1 SFDE. All other uses shall be assigned an equivalency factor which is representative of the contribution of wastewater expected to be generated by the particular use. The equivalency factor shall take into account the volume of wastewater flows expected to be produced by the Connector and any other characteristics of the Connector's wastewater which may have an impact on the Wastewater Facilities. However, in no event shall any Connector be assigned an equivalency factor of less than 1 SFDE.

e. For purposes of this Agreement the amount of Cp attributable to Developer's wastewater contribution shall be <u>5</u> SFDE.

# 2. Collection of Supplemental Connection Charges

a. District shall use its best efforts to collect Supplemental Connection charges from all persons who become obligated to pay them. However, District may postpone or waive, in whole or in part, collection of any such charges if, after reasonable notice and hearing, the District Board, in the exercise of reasonable discretion, makes one of the following determinations:

- Acting pursuant to Health and Safety Code Section 6520.6, the District Board determines the amount is too small to justify the cost of collection; or
- (2) The District Board determines that in the interest of the public health, safety and welfare, collection of the amount is not justified; or
- (3) The District Board determines that collection of the amount would pose an undue financial hardship on the new Connector.

If such a determination is made by the District Board, the determination shall be binding, and neither Developer, Connectors or any other person shall have a claim against District by reason of District's failure to collect any amount which is the subject of such a determination. b. District's obligation to collect Supplemental Connection Charges shall cease upon the first of the following events to occur:

- (1) The lapse of twenty-five (25) years from the date of District's approval and acceptance of the Wastewater Facilities; or
- (2) At any time District no longer has the legal authority to collect these charges.

c. Nothing in this Agreement shall be interpreted to require District to allow connections to be made to the Wastewater Facilities. Connections may be denied by District under any circumstances including, but not limited to the following:

- (1) District does not have sufficient capacity to serve the proposed connection(s); or
- (2) District is precluded by law from allowing the connection(s); or
- (3) The proposed connection(s) are not in compliance with established policies and regulations of District.

#### 3. Reimbursement

a. For purposes of this paragraph 3, the persons to whom reimbursement shall be made by District are referred to as "Reimbursees."

b. The following persons are Reimbursees and shall be entitled to reimbursement as provided in this paragraph 3:

- (1) Developer; and
- (2) Prior Connectors who have paid Supplemental Connection Charges.

c. Except as provided in subparagraph 3.d. below, as Supplemental Connection Charges are collected from each new Connector for each new connection, District shall credit the account of each Reimbursee with a proportionate share of the charges collected based upon the ratio which each Reimbursee's discharge entitlement, measured in SFDEs, bears to the total of all wastewater discharge entitlements, measured in SFDEs, for all Reimbursees, less District's reasonable administrative cost to make the collection and reimbursement of the Supplemental Connection Charge.

d. In the case of any prior Connector who is a Reimbursee pursuant to subparagraph 3.b. above but who, pursuant to the provisions of subparagraph 2.a. of this Agreement, has not been required by the District to pay the full Supplemental Connection Charge which otherwise should have been imposed, such a connector shall be entitled to reimbursement, but only to the extent provided in this subparagraph. In calculating such a Connector's reimbursement amount pursuant to subparagraph 3.c. above, the Connector's wastewater discharge entitlement shall be discounted in the same ratio as

the amount of the Supplemental Connection Charge actually paid by the Connector bears to the Supplemental Connection Charge which the connector should have paid except for the effect of the provisions of subparagraph 2.a.

e. Payment of amounts credited will be made by District within a reasonable time after Supplemental Connection Charges are collected

f. In the absence of written instructions in form and substance acceptable to District, District's reimbursement obligations to any Reimbursee shall be deemed fully satisfied upon sending the reimbursement payment(s) to the Developer and, if applicable, to prior Connectors, who paid the Supplemental Connection Charge to the addresses shown for such persons in District's records. Each Reimbursee shall be responsible to inform the District of any changes. If District becomes aware that a dispute exists regarding the identity of the person to whom the payment is due, District may withhold the payment until the dispute is resolved to District's satisfaction.

A Reimbursee may assign the Reimbursee's reimbursement rights under this Agreement; provided, however, that insofar as District's rights and obligations are concerned, any such assignment shall be effective only if (1) District is provided with evidence, satisfactory to District, of the regularity and authenticity of the assignment and (2) the parties to the assignment have executed and delivered to District instruments in form and substance satisfactory to District which relieve District from any liability or obligation by reason of District's reliance upon and performance of its duties in conformity with the provisions of the assignment.

g. Interest shall not accrue on any funds collected and held for the account of persons pursuant to the provisions of this Agreement, and no person shall have a claim against District for interest on such funds; provided, however, that the provisions of this subparagraph do not preclude application of the interest factor provided for in subparagraph 1.b. above.

#### 4. <u>Connectors' Approval of Agreement</u>

As a condition of the District's approval of any connection to the Wastewater Facilities, the District may require a Connector to execute an instrument, in form and substance acceptable to District, which evidences Connector's acknowledgment of the Terms and Conditions of this Agreement and consent to be bound thereby.

#### 5. Miscellaneous Provisions

a. This Agreement constitutes the entire understanding and agreement between the parties.

b. This Agreement may not be modified or amended except by a further written agreement executed by all parties who are signatories hereto.

c. This Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties, their assigns, personal representatives and successors in interest.

At the option of District, the signatures of the persons executing this Agreement on d. behalf of the parties shall be acknowledged and the Agreement shall be recorded in the Official Records of San Mateo County.

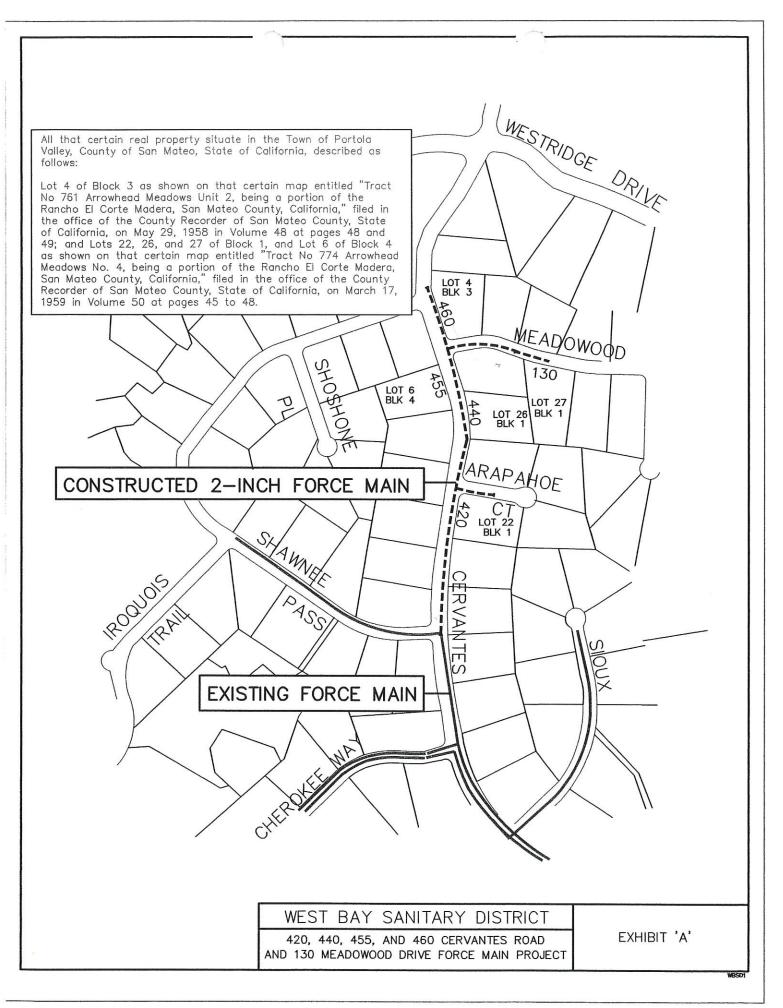

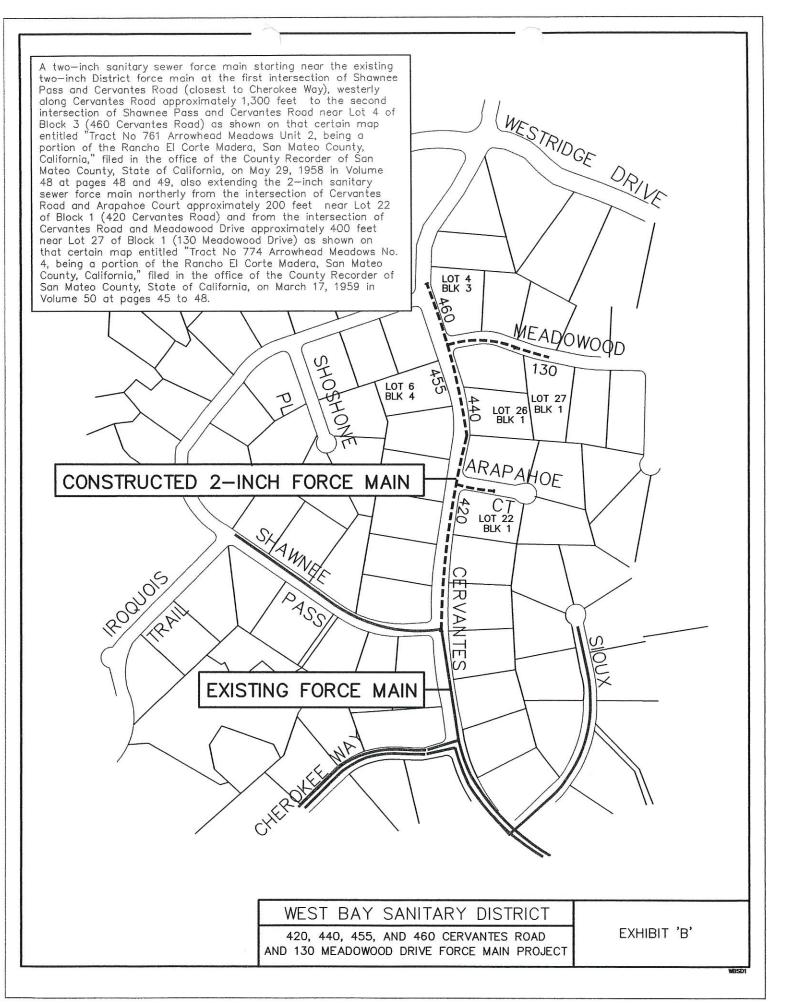

#### **Background**

The District requires an easement to construct the Avy Altschul Pump Station in Menlo Park which will supply additional wastewater flow to the West Bay-Sharon Heights Golf and County Club Recycled Water Facility. #### <u>Analysis</u>

An appraisal was conducted at the request of the Las Lomitas Elementary School District. The appraised value was \$49,000.00. The appraisal was performed by J Kaeuper & Company. The District's General Counsel and the School District's Attorney then agreed on the terms and language of the grant of easement.

#### Fiscal Impact

A consideration of \$49,000.00 was considered for the grant of easement based on the J Kaeuper & Company appraisal. The easement will be funded in part or entirely by the State Revolving Fund Loan and Grant. The SRF loan will be paid back by Sharon Heights Golf and Country Club.

A perpetual easement to construct, install, maintain, use, repair, remove, and replace pumps, a pipeline, fittings, electrical, and other facilities necessary for the operation of a wastewater pump station in the area within the real property in the Menlo Park, County of San Mateo, State of California; more particularly described in Exhibit "A" and "B", attached hereto, and by this reference incorporated herein (the "Easement Area"), under the following terms and conditions:

1. West Bay, its employees and agents shall have the right to enter upon the Easement Area at any and all times with such tools and equipment as may be necessary or convenient for the exercise of the rights herein granted to West Bay provided, however, that absent exigent circumstances, West Bay shall coordinate with District to ensure that maintenance activities avoid disruption of District operations. For example, maintenance that involves activities that generate noise, dust, fumes or other impacts sufficient to disrupt classroom instruction shall, to the full extent feasible, be performed after hours or while school is not in session.

2. No building or structure of any kind shall be constructed upon the Easement Area, and should a building or structure be erected in violation of this provision, West Bay and its successors and assigns may nevertheless exercise all rights herein granted and shall have the right to remove, or cause Grantor to remove, any building or structure that may be erected upon the Easement Area. West Bay shall not be held liable in any manner whatsoever for any damages thereby incurred, nor shall West Bay have any obligation to replace any structure that may be removed from the Easement Area.

3. West Bay shall, at all times, maintain the Easement Area and all equipment in the Easement Area in good condition and repair, and shall indemnify, defend and hold District harmless from any and all liability arising from West Bay's use of the Easement Area and shall, at all times, maintain adequate and appropriate policies of liability insurance or equivalent liability protection, which policies or protection shall be subject to District's review and approval, which approval shall not be unreasonably

withheld. If West Bay fails to maintain the Easement Area in good condition and repair, the Grantor shall, after reasonable written notice to West Bay, be entitled to make any necessary corrections to site conditions and to invoice West Bay for the related costs.

4. The easement granted herein shall automatically terminate in the event that West Bay decommissions or discontinues the use of the facilities to be constructed within the Easement Area and, in that event West Bay shall, upon request by District, promptly execute a quitclaim or other suitable documentation evidencing such termination, remove such facilities, and restore the easement area, to the extent reasonably feasible, to is pre-existing condition.

This grant of easement shall be binding upon and shall inure to the benefit of the respective administrators, executors, personal representatives, successors and assigns of the parties hereto.

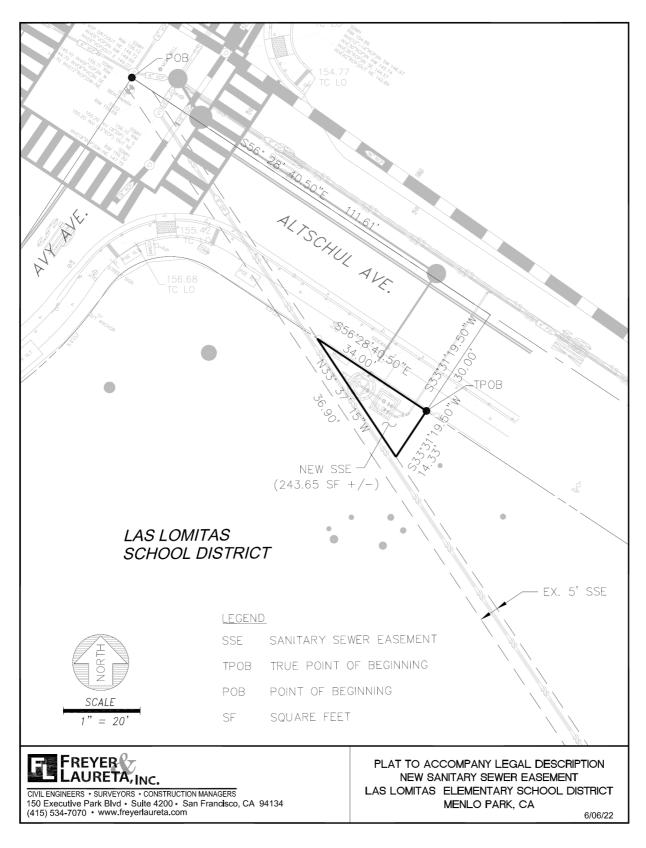

#### REAL PROPERTY PURCHASE AGREEMENT

This Real Property Purchase Agreement ("Agreement") is entered into by and between the LAS LOMITAS ELEMENTARY SCHOOL DISTRICT, a public elementary school district formed and existing under the laws of the State of California ("District" or "Seller") and WEST BAY SANITARY DISTRICT, a special district organized and existing under the Sanitary District Act of 1923 ("West Bay" or "Buyer"), as of the latest date of execution set forth on the signature page below (the "**Effective Date**"). The District and West Bay may each be referred to from time to time in this Agreement as a "Party," and, collectively, as the "Parties."

#### **RECITALS**

This Agreement is entered into with reference to the following facts:

A. Seller is the owner in fee simple of real property commonly known as 1101 Altschul Avenue, Menlo Park, California 94024, identified as Assessor's Parcel Nos. 074-170-430, 074-170-530, 074-184-100 and 074-190-030 in the Records of the San Mateo County Assessor (the **"Subject Property"**).

B. Buyer seeks to acquire an exclusive easement (the "Easement") in a portion of the Subject Property to construct and operate the Avy/Altschul Pump Station Project ("**Project**"), as more particularly shown and described in the Easement Deed attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference as Exhibit A to this Agreement.

#### C. <u>AGREEMENT</u>

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing Recitals, which are incorporated herein by this reference, and other valuable consideration, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, the Parties hereto agree as follows:

1. <u>Purchase Price</u>. The total purchase price (the "**Purchase Price**") to be paid by Buyer to Seller for the Easement shall be Forty-Nine Thousand Dollars (\$49,000.00) to be deposited by Buyer into escrow within five (5) business days of the Effective Date. The Parties acknowledge and agree that the total compensation to be paid by Buyer for the Easement is the Purchase Price, which amount is the full and complete acquisition cost based upon the fair market value of the Easement as determined by an independent appraiser. Buyer shall have no obligation to Seller under the California Relocation Assistance and Real Property Acquisition statutes and guidelines due to the acquisition of the Easement under this Agreement.

2. <u>Conditions Precedent</u>. Buyer's obligation to perform under this Agreement shall be subject to Seller's performance under this Agreement, and satisfaction or waiver by Buyer of the following conditions:

A. <u>Title.</u> As soon as practicable following the opening of Escrow, the Escrow Holder shall cause to be issued a Preliminary Report regarding the Property, which Preliminary

Report shall be prepared at Buyer's expense. Buyer shall have ten (10) days from the date of receipt of the Preliminary Report, and copies of all recorded Exceptions to title set forth in this Preliminary Report, within which to review and approve the Exceptions to title. Should Buyer disapprove of any Exception to title described in this Preliminary Report, Buyer shall, within this ten (10)-day period, give written notice to Seller of Buyer's disapproval of any Exception therein. Failure to so notify Seller within this ten (10)-day period, shall constitute approval and a waiver by Buyer of this condition. Should Buyer give timely written notice to Seller of their disapproval of any such Exception, Seller shall have ten (10) days from receipt of Buyer's notice within which to notify Buyer in writing of Seller's intent to remove such Exception(s) during the pendency of escrow. Seller's refusal to so agree, or Seller's failure to notify Buyer within this ten (10)-day period of Seller's agreement to remove the disapproved Exception(s) prior to the Close of Escrow, shall give Buyer the right to terminate this Agreement by giving written notice to Seller within ten (10) days following the date of receipt of Seller's refusal or from the end of the ten (10)-day period within which Seller is to so notify Buyer, whichever is earlier. Failure of Buyer to give timely written notice of termination shall constitute a waiver of this right to terminate this Agreement.

2. <u>Warranties and Representations of Seller</u>. Seller hereby represents and warrants to Buyer the following, it being expressly understood and agreed that all such representations and warranties are to be true and correct as of the Close of Escrow and shall survive the Close of Escrow:

A. That Seller is the sole owner of the Subject Property clear of all liens, claims, encumbrances, encroachments from adjacent properties, encroachments by improvements on the Subject Property or rights of way of any nature, other than those that may appear on the title commitment.

B. Neither this Agreement nor anything provided to be done hereunder including the transfer of the Easement to Buyer, violates or shall violate any contract, agreement or instrument to which Seller is a party, or which affects the Easement, and the sale of the Easement herein contemplated does not require the consent of any party not a signatory hereto.

C. Seller has no knowledge of any pending, threatened, or potential litigation, action or proceeding against Seller or any other Party before any court or administrative tribunal, which is in any way related to the Easement.

3. <u>Escrow</u>. The parties shall establish an Escrow to accommodate the transaction contemplated by this Agreement. For purposes of this Agreement, Opening of Escrow shall mean the date on which the Escrow Holder shall have received a fully executed original of this Agreement from the parties. Buyer shall bear all costs related to the Escrow.

A. <u>Deed</u>. Attached hereto as Exhibit A is a copy of the form of Easement Deed to be executed by Seller as materially set forth in Exhibit A, in favor of Buyer, to be recorded by Escrow Holder upon the Close of Escrow. Seller shall deposit a fully and duly executed form of Easement Deed into Escrow before the Close of Escrow, as defined herein.

B. <u>Close of Escrow</u>. The Close of Escrow shall mean the date upon which the Deeds are recorded in the Official Records of the County of San Mateo. The parties shall seek to have the Close of Escrow occur within thirty (30) days from the Effective Date of this Agreement; however, the Close of Escrow shall not be more than forty-five (45) days from the Effective Date of this Agreement (the "**Closing Date**"). If a delay in the Closing Date is due to the default of a party, the non-defaulting party, at their election, may extend the Closing Date to allow the defaulting party additional time to cure the default.

C. <u>Title Insurance</u>. Buyer shall receive a CLTA Standard Coverage policy unless Buyer has chosen another policy and instructed Escrow Holder in writing of the policy chosen. Any title insurance premium for title insurance issued to Buyer shall be paid in full by Buyer.

D. <u>Property Taxes and Special Assessments</u>. From and after the Closing Date, Buyer shall be solely responsible for the payment of any and all Property Taxes imposed and shall assume any non-delinquent installments due on any assessment bonds imposed on the Property. Seller shall be solely responsible for any installments due on any assessment bonds due prior to the Closing Date.

E. <u>Costs</u>. Buyer shall pay for the cost of the ALTA Owner's Standard Coverage Policy of Title Insurance, the Escrow fees and Escrow Holder's customary out-of-pocket expenses for messenger services, long distance telephone, etc. Buyer shall pay for recording the Deeds and any documentary or other local transfer taxes, and any other recording fees. If the Escrow shall fail to close through no fault of either party, Buyer shall pay the Escrow cancellation charges.

F. <u>Authorization to Record Documents and Disburse Funds</u>. Escrow Holder is hereby authorized to record the Easement Deed and disburse the Purchase Price called for hereunder upon the Close of Escrow, provided each of the following conditions has then been fulfilled:

i. Escrow Holder issues in favor of Buyer the Title Policy, showing the Subject Property vested in Seller;

ii. Seller shall have deposited in Escrow the Escrow Deed required in Section 5(A); and

iii. Buyer shall have deposited in escrow the Purchase Price.

G. <u>Further Instructions</u>. Each party agrees to execute such other and further Escrow instructions as may be necessary or proper in order to consummate the transaction contemplated by this Agreement.

4. <u>License to Enter</u>. Seller hereby grants to Buyer and Buyer's authorized agents, contractors, and consultants a license to enter upon the Subject Property for the purpose of making inspections and other examinations of the Easement during the Escrow period including, but not limited to, the right to perform soil and geological tests of that site and an environmental site assessment thereof, subject to the following:

A. Buyer shall give Seller at least 72-hour telephone notice before entering Seller's Land, which notice requires Buyer to include the name of the company, the person and their purpose for access to the Subject Property.

B. Buyer shall provide Seller with a copy of any soil, geological test and environmental site assessment of the Subject Property.

C. Buyer does hereby indemnify and forever save Seller, Seller's heirs, successors and assigns, and the Subject Property, free and harmless from and against any and all liability, loss, damages and costs and expenses, demands, causes of action, claims or judgments, whether or not arising from or occurring out of any damage to the Subject Property as a result of any accident or other occurrence at Subject Property which is in any way connected with Buyer's inspections or non-permanent improvements involving entrance onto the Subject Property pursuant to this Section. If Buyer fails to acquire the Easement due to Buyer's default, this license shall terminate upon the termination of Buyer's right to purchase the Easement. In such event, Buyer shall remove or cause to be removed all Buyer's personal property, facilities, tools and equipment from the Subject Property.

5. <u>AS-IS Clause</u>. Buyer acknowledges that it is familiar with all aspects relating to the Easement. Buyer specifically acknowledges that this Agreement gives to Buyer a right to purchase the Property on an "AS IS WITH ALL FAULTS" basis and that, except as otherwise may be provided in this Agreement, Buyer is not relying on any representations or warranties of any kind whatsoever, express or implied, from Seller or its agents or employees, as to any matters concerning the Easement area, including without limitation: (a) the quality, nature, adequacy and physical condition of soils, geology and any groundwater; (b) the development potential of the Easement area, and the Easement area's use, habitability, merchantability, fitness, suitability, value or adequacy for any particular purpose; and (c) the presence or release of hazardous or toxic materials, as those terms are defined in any local, state or federal statute or regulation, including, without limitation, petroleum and petroleum by products, on, under, about or from the Easement area or the adjoining or neighboring property.

6. <u>Notices.</u> All notices and other communications under this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be deemed to have been duly given on the date of service if served personally on the party to whom notice is to be given, one business day following delivery to a reputable overnight courier for next day delivery, the third day after mailing if mailed to the party to whom notice is to be given, by first class mail, registered or certified, postage prepaid, or on the date a fax confirmation sheet indicates transmission by fax has been received. All such notices and other communications shall be addressed to the parties as follows:

Any party may change its address for purposes of this paragraph by giving the other parties written notice of the new address in the manner set forth above.

7. <u>Applicable Law</u>. This Agreement shall be construed and interpreted under, and governed and enforced according, to the laws of the State of California. Any judicial actions brought pursuant to this Agreement shall be filed in San Mateo County Superior Court.

8. <u>Entire Agreement</u>. This Agreement supersedes any prior agreement, oral or written, and together with the Exhibits hereto and any agreements delivered pursuant hereto, contains the entire agreement between the parties on the subject matter hereof. No subsequent agreement, representation or promise made by either party hereto, or by or to any employee, officer, agent or representative of either party, shall be of any effect unless it is in writing and executed by the party to be bound thereby. No person is authorized to make, and by execution hereof, the parties acknowledge that no person has made, any representation, warranty, guaranty or promise except as set forth herein; and no agreement, statement, representation or promise made by any such person which is not contained herein shall be valid or binding on either party.

9. <u>Successors and Assigns</u>. This Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the heirs, executors, administrators, successors, and assigns of the parties hereto, and shall survive Close of Escrow.

10. <u>Tax Withholding</u>. To the extent applicable to this transaction, Seller and Buyer shall comply with federal (FIRPTA) and California tax withholding laws.

11. <u>Attorneys' Fees.</u> In the event of a suit relating to, arising out of, or in order to enforce any provision of this Contract, the Parties agree that each Party shall bear their own attorney's fees and costs.

12. <u>Default</u>. In the event of a breach or default under this Agreement by either party, the non-defaulting party shall have, in addition to all rights available at law or equity, the right to terminate this Agreement and the Escrow for the purchase and sale of the Easement, by delivering written notice thereof to the defaulting party and to Escrow Holder, and if Buyer is the non-defaulting party, Seller shall pay Escrow cancellation charges. Such termination of the Escrow by a non-defaulting party shall be without prejudice to the non-defaulting party's rights and remedies at law or equity.

13. <u>Time</u>. Time is of the essence of this Agreement, and of all performances required under this Agreement.

14. <u>Amendments</u>. Any amendments to this Agreement shall be effectively only when duly executed by the parties and deposited with Escrow Holder.

15. <u>Interpretation</u>. The parties agree that each party has reviewed and revised this Agreement and have had the opportunity to have their counsel and real estate advisors review and revise this agreement and that any rule of construction to the effect that ambiguities are to be resolved against the drafting party shall not apply in the interpretation of this Agreement or any amendments or exhibits thereto. In this Agreement the neuter gender includes the feminine and masculine, and singular number includes the plural, and the words "person" and "party" include corporation, partnership, firm, trust, or association wherever the context so requires. The recitals and captions of the sections and subsections of this Agreement are for convenience and reference only, and the words contained therein shall in no way be held to explain, modify, amplify or aid in the interpretation, construction or meaning of the provisions of this Agreement.

16. <u>Counterparts</u>. This Agreement may be executed in any number of counterparts, each of which shall be deemed to be an original, but all of which together shall constitute one and the same instrument. A scanned, electronic, facsimile, or other copy of a party's signature shall be accepted and valid as an original.

17. <u>Warranty of Authority</u>. The signatories to this Agreement warrant and represent that each is authorized to execute this Agreement and that their respective signatures serve to legally obligate their respective representatives, agents, successors, and assigns to comply with the provisions of this Agreement.
